UNIVERSITY OF LONDON GENERAL CERTIFICATES OF EDUCATION (*April, 1951 to March, 1952*)

The subjects in which boys were entered, included Greek, Latin, French, German, Spanish, English, History, Geography, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Botany, Zoology, Art, Handicraft, Music, Surveying, Practical Geometry, Economics, Economic History and Statistics.

General Certificates of Education with subjects at Scholarship, Advanced and Ordinary level have now replaced the Higher School and General School Certificates. Scholarship and Advanced level candidates are normally aged 18 years; Ordinary level are aged 16 years. At present the University does not divulge Scholarship level results. *In the following list, therefore, candidates took subjects at Ordinary level unless the candidates' name is in italics which indicate Advanced level.*
